

due to his said wards and it further appearing from statements made by said Guardian to this Court that after the payment of all expenses as shown by said account that he has but the sum of \$592.87, with which to pay the amount due unto his said wards, which is occasioned from the fact that the funds due his said wards had been deposited in the Savings bank of Brunswick which failed and has not paid its depositors in full, and it further appearing that the Bond of the said Guardian is only in the penalty of One Hundred Dollars, (\$100.00) with Dr. Levin West as sole surviving surety, and the said surety, the said Dr. Levin West being personally in Court and admitting his liability on account of the amount of said Guardian is in default so far as his said suretyship is concerned, to wit the sum of One Hundred dollars, which sum he desires to pay into Court or to the new Guardian to be appointed and to be released and discharged from all further liability as surety, and it further appearing to the Court upon statement made in open Court by said William Schnauffer Guardian, that he the said William Schnauffer being unable to pay the balance after the payment of the above sum of \$132.33, prefers himself ready and willing to confess judgment to the newly appointed Guardian for the above sum of money in order that the books in this Court may be properly balanced as to said Guardian. Therefore it is Ordered by the Orphans Court for Frederick County and by the Authority thereof, this 24th day of June, 1913, that William Schnauffer, guardian to Viola Seeberger, et. al., be and he is hereby released and discharged from said Guardianship, provided he the said Guardian pays over to Viola Seeberger, the newly appointed Guardian the sum of \$592.87, the amount of cash money in said Guardians hands for the use and benefit of said infants, and further that said William Schnauffer, will confess a judgment to the newly appointed guardian in the sum of \$132.33; it is further ordered by the Court that Dr. Levin West, surety on the bond of said William Schnauffer, Guardian, pay into this Court the sum of One Hundred Dollars the amount of his liability under said Bond, which sum is to be received and considered as a part of the money due by said Guardian to said infants, and upon said payment it is ordered that said Dr. Levin West be and he is hereby discharged from all further liability on account of his said suretyship.

It is further ordered by the Court that Viola Seeberger, be and she is hereby appointed Guardian of the estate of the said Grever Cleveland Seeberger, Albert Seeberger, Julia Seeberger, and William Seeberger, infants, and she shall give a Bond unto the State of Maryland for the faithful Discharge of her said Guardianship in the penalty of the sum of at least double the amount of money coming into her hands as said Guardian.
