BILL OF COMPLAINT.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County sitting as a
 Court of Equity.

The Bill of Complaint of George Robertsen Dennis, Jr., and Charles C. Carty and
 Harry E. Carty, partners, trading as C. C. Carty, on behalf of themselves as well
 as all other creditors of James Alonzo Belt who may come in and contribute to the
 costs and expenses of this proceeding, respectfully shows unto your Honors--
 1st. That Alonzo Belt was in his lifetime and at the time of his death seized and
 possessed of a certain piece or parcel of land situated in Urbana District in the
 County of Frederick, State of Maryland, which was conveyed unto him by deed execut-
 ed by Frank Belt et. al., the heirs at law of John Belt, bearing date the 23rd day
 of feby. A. D. 1905, and duly recorded among the land records of Frederick County
 as will appear by reference to a certified copy of said deed filed herewith, marked
 "Exhibit A" which together with all other exhibits herewith filed, it is prayed
 may be taken as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

2d. That the deed "Exhibit A" is an heirs deed of the property of Jehn Belt, de-
 ceased, and said deed was not executed by Calvin belt and Fannie Belt, his wife, of
 Pittsburg, Penna., although duly executed and acknowledged by the remaining chil-
 dren and heirs at law of the said John Belt; and the said Calvin Belt and Fannie
 Belt, his wife are joined herein for the purpose of passing title to their interest
 in the property mentioned in exhibit A.

3rd. That the said James Alonzo Belt was indebted unto your complainant, the said
 George Robertson Dennis, Jr., in the sum of One Hundred dollars, (\$100.00) on an
 open accpunt, as will appear by reference to a memorandum of said account filed
 herewith and marked "Exhibit B".

4th. That the said James Alonzo Belt was indebted unto your Complainants, Charles
 C. Carty and Harry E. Carty, partners, trading as C. C. Carty, in the sum of One
 Hundred, thirty-two & 52/100 dollars, (\$132.50) on an open account as will appear
 by reference to a memorandum of said account filed herewith and marked exhibit "C".

5th. That the said James Alonzo Belt being indebted as aforesaid, departed this
 life on or about the 30th day of October 1912, leaving surviving him a widow, the
 said Edna belt, and an infant son, Rey Belt.

6th. That the personal estate of which the said James Alonzo Belt died seized and
 possessed was insufficient to pay the costs of administration thereon and conse-
 quently no letters of administration have been taken out on said estate, and it is
 necessary, in order that the claims of your Complainants may be paid, that the real
 estate mentioned in exhibit A should be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court
 and that the proceeds therefrom after the payment of the claims of your Complainants
 and such other creditors of the said James Alonzo belt who may come in and contrib-
 ute to the costs and expenses of this suit, may be distributed among the parties
