PETITION AND COURT'S ORDER TO AMEND BILL OF COMPLAINT.

To the Honorable the Judges of said Court.

The petition of Garden Streng, the Plaintiff in the above entitled case, respectfully shows--

That all the defendants to the Bill of Complaint in this case are non-residents of the State of Maryland, as therein stated, and the places of residence of certain ones of said defendants are stated in the first paragraph of said Bill as follows--"Defendants George W. Waters, and Ida H. Waters his wife reside in the town of Weiser, State of Idaho; the defendant Sarah D. Waters resides in the town of Boise, State of Idaho; defendant Benoni D. Waters resides in the town of Mabton, State of Washington", it being further alleged in the first paragraph that the defendants Frederick L. Waters and Robert T. Waters are non-residents of the State of Maryland and their whereabouts are to your orator unknown, but the places of residence of said defendants were inadvertently omitted from the prayer for the order of publication in said Bill and consequently from the order of publication heretofore issued thereon, and your petitioner prays that leave may be granted him to amend said Bill by interlining in the prayer for the order of publication therein the statement of the places of residence of the said defendants as given in the first paragraph thereof and also the statement of the fact that the whereabouts of the other said defendants namely Frederick L. Waters and Robert T. Waters, are unknown to your orator as therein stated--to the end that the said prayer for the order of publication may conform to the said first paragraph of the Bill of Complaint. And your petitioner prays that leave may be granted him to further amend said bill by interlining in said prayer for the order of publication, in the appropriate place with reference to said defendants, the words, 'and all of whom are adults. And that your petitioner may have all such other and further relief to which he may be entitled he will ever pray. And as in duty, &c.

ORDER OF PUBLICATION.
