

11. Now tell us about the children of Mrs. Emily Allnuttyour mother?

There are eight children, Joseph M. Allnutt, who married Lucy W. Allnutt, and lives at Peelesville, this county; Frederick A. Allnutt, who is married to Ada P. Allnutt, and lives at Senaca, in this county, Robert W. Allnutt, married to Alice T. Allnutt and lives at Dawsenville, in this county; Lewis P. Allnutt, married to Lottie C. Allnutt, and lives at Dawsenville, in this county; Charles E. Allnutt, married to Effie M. Allnutt, and lives at Senaca, in this county; Benoni D. Allnutt, unmarried, and lives at Dawsenville, in this county; Nellie Allnutt, unmarried, and lives at Dawsenville, in this county; Lawrence E. Allnutt, myself, unmarried and I live at Dawsenville, in this county.

12. As I understand then the only children of Mr. Benini Dawson who married were Mrs. Darby, Mrs. Waters, and Mrs. Allnutt, your mother.

Yes, sir.

13. These last three are dead and I now ask if the persons you have named as their children are all the children they had.

Yes, sir.

14. Are they all living?

Yes, all of those that I have mentioned.

Mr. Allnutt, this suit is for the partition of lot 49, on Willy James' plat of Sugar Leaf Mountain beginning at a stone marked B##49, and running N. 87 perches to stone # 1; thence W. 68 perches to stone # 2; thence S. 87 perches to stone #1, thence W. 68 perches, to stone #2, thence S. 87 perches to stone # B. 42, thence with a straight line to the beginning, containing 34.75 acres more or less. This land is located on the Sugar Leaf Mountain in Frederick County, Maryland, and is described in the Bill filed in this suit, as I have outlined it.

You were a part owner of this land, and recently joined in a conveyance of the interest of yourself and certain others to Mr. Gerden Streng, the Plaintiff here in. I now ask you if this land, 19/24th of which stands in the name of the Plaintiff, and the remainder in the name of the defendants, can, in your opinion be divided among the parties without less or injury to them.

No it cannot.

16. What in your opinion is a fair value of this land per acre?

Five dollars. That is about what I think it is worth.

2. What children did the late Benini Dawson have?

Frederick A., Susan A., Adelaide L., Robert P., Martha, Elizabeth, Emily and another one whose name I have forgotten, but she died years ago unmarried.
