To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court--

Your oratrixes; who sue as well for themselves as for all other creditors of  
Scott S. Welty, late of Frederick County, deceased, who will come in and contrib-  
ute to the expense of this suit, complaining say--

First--That the said Scott S. Welty was in his lifetime indebted unto your ora-  
trices in the sum of One hundred Dollars by reason of your oratrices becoming  
sureties for the said Scott S. Welty upon a certain promissory note, joint and  
several in form, dated on the 2nd day of October, 1911, payable to the Citizens  
National Bank of Frederick six months after date, which note your oratrices  
paid to said Bank after its maturity, together with the accrued interest there-  
on, and in which note the said Scott S. Welty was the principal who received the  
benefit thereof, and your oratrices were the sureties for him to said bank, and  
they file herewith the said note marked Exhibit A., which with all the other ex-  
hibits herewith filed they pray may be taken and considered as part of this Bill  
of Complaint as fully as if herein at large set forth.

Second--That your said oratrices also became sureties for the said Scott S. Welty  
in his life time, to said bank on two other promissory notes, the one for the sum  
of \$400.00, which matured on the 26th day of April 1912, and the other for the sum  
of \$200.00 which will mature on July 14, 1912, and another note to the Frederick-  
town savings Institution for the sum of \$200.00 which will mature on the 11th day  
of May 1912, and another note to the Franklin Savings Bank of Frederick for  
the sum of \$100.00 which will mature on June 11th 1912, and also on another note  
to the Frederick County National Bank for the sum of \$900.00 which will mature on  
September 13th 1912, all of which notes are unpaid and in all of which the said  
Scott S. Welty is the principal and your oratrices are his sureties.

Third--That the said Scott S. Welty being so indebted as aforesaid to your oratrices  
and also unto divers other persons and corporations in considerable sums of money,  
and having real estate in Frederick City in Frederick County, as hereinafter set  
forth, departed this life on or about the 19th day of March in the year 1912, in-  
testate and leaving a widow Virginia D. Welty, who is an adult residing in Freder-  
ick, and two minor children as his only heirs at law, named Hammond Welty and  
Franklin Welty, who reside with their mother in said City and county.

Fourth--That at the time of his death the said Scott S. Welty left no personal es-  
tate in consequence of which no administration was granted to any one, or if he  
did leave any personal estate the same is of small value and wholly insufficient  
to pay all his just debts owing at the time of his death, funeral expenses and  
costs of administration.

Fifth-- That your oratrices are advised that the real estate of said intestate now  
in the hands of his said widow and heirs at law, or so much thereof as may be neces-  
sary for that purpose, ought to be sold to pay the just debts of your oratrices and
