M. all the following lots or parcels of ground situated in said City and described as follows-- Parcel I.-- All that lot situated at the Northwest corner of Brewer's alley and West All Saints street, fronting 47.1 feet on said All Saints street and running back with Brewer's Alley 68 feet improved by a dwelling house and barber shop and designated as Lot No. 1 on the Plat of the division of the Brewery property made by the Trustee.
