ORDER OF PUBLICATION.

The object of the Bill of Complaint in the above entitled cause is to procure the of a farm containing about One Hundred acres, situated between Hansenville and Lewistown, in Frederick County Maryland, being the same property which was conveyed to John W. Miller by deed executed by John Bowers and wife, dated February 19th 1874, and recorded in liber T. G. No. 1 folio 627, one of the land records of Frederick County, The Bill states in substance--

That John W. Miller died on or about December 3 1899, intestate and left surviving him a widow and several children, that his widow Julia J. Miller occupied said farm as life tenant until her death in 1910, and that the following children of the said John W. Miller as his heirs at law survive--A son, John W. L. Miller, a daughter, Mary E. Haines, whose husband's name is Andrew Haines; a daughter Julia E. Hummer, whose husband's name is Joseph H. Hummer; a son, C. Hicks Miller, whose wife's name is Laura Miller; a son Franklin Miller, whose wife's name is Fransina Miller; a daughter, Dorothy M. C. Stull, whose husband's name is Sylvester N. Stull, all of the above named parties being adults and residents of Frederick County, Maryland, and the following infants, children of George F. Miller, a deceased son; John M. Miller, Effie Miller and Harvey M. Miller, all of said infants being residents of Zenia, Montgomery county, Ohio and have no guardian within the jurisdiction of this Court.

The Bill further states that the parties Plaintiff and defendant in this cause are all the parties in interest, and that it is to the benefit and advantage of all the parties concerned to have the real estate above described sold and the proceeds therefrom distributed among the parties thereunto entitled according to their respective rights and interests.

The Bill prays for a decree for the sale of said real estate and for general relief; for summons against the resident defendants and an order of publication against the non-resident infant defendants, warning them to appear in the Circuit Court for Frederick County either in person or by solicitor on some day certain to be named therein.

It is thereupon this 27th day of December, A. D. 1910, ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, that the Plaintiffs, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once a week for three successive weeks prior to the 26th day of January 1911, give notice to the said John W. Miller, Effie Miller and Harvey K. Miller, infants and non-residents of the State of Maryland, of the object and substance of this Bill and warning them and each of them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 11th day of February, A. D. 1911, to show cause if any they have why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
