

of said Court, wherein it was stated that John W. Miller, late of Frederick County was in his life time and at the time of his death seized and possessed of a certain farm containing one hundred acres of land, more or less situated between Hansenville and Lewistown, in Frederick County, Maryland, as set out in full in the Bill of Complaint.

2d. That since the filing of said Bill of Complaint and after the taking of the testimony in the aforesaid cause, it appears that the said John W. Miller was the owner in his lifetime and at the time of his death, of two parcels of mountain land located in Frederick County Maryland, the deeds for which said parcels of mountain land were not put upon record among the land records of Frederick County until June 14th 1911, and the possession of said Mountain land was unknown to the solicitors of your petitioners at the time of the filing of the original Bill of Complaint and until the original deeds for said mountain land were located among the papers of the said John W. Miller, deceased. The said Mountain Land of which the said John W. Miller was possessed being, first--a

a parcel of land containing 8 acres, 3 rods and 12 perches of land, fully described in a deed from Jacob Mert and Julia Ann Mert, his wife, to John William Miller, dated March 11, 1857, and recorded among the land records of Frederick County, in liber H. W. B. No. 296, folio one of the land records of Frederick County, as will fully appear by reference to a certified copy of said deed filed here as a part hereof and marked "exhibit B" which together with all other exhibits herewith filed, it is prayed may be taken as a part of this supplemental Bill of Complaint as well as of the original bill. the second of said parcels of mountain land contains 6 acres, 3, rods and 18 square perches, more or less, and was conveyed unto the said John William Miller, by Andrew Wachter and Doctor R. Wachter, trustees, by deed dated March 30th 1886, and duly recorded among the land records of Frederick County in liber H. W. B. No. 296 folio as will fully appear by reference to a certified copy of said deed filed herewith and marked "exhibit C."

3rd. Your petitioner further states that the parties to this supplemental bill of complaint are all the parties in interest, they being the same parties as set out in the paragraph two of the original bill of complaint filed March 17 1910,

except that, since the filing of said original Bill of Complaint John W. Miller of Xenia, Montgomery county, Ohio, has attained the age of twenty-one years.

4th. That the land described in Exhibit B and C herein referred to is not susceptible of division among the parties thereunto entitled without loss and injury, and the same should therefore be sold and the proceeds divided among the parties thereunto entitled according to their respective rights and interests.
To the end therefore--

(a) That the said real estate described in Exhibits B and C may be sold at the same time that the land described in Exhibit A in the original bill of complaint and the proceeds of all of said property be divided among the parties thereunto entitled.

(b) That your complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.

May it please Your Honors to grant unto your Complainants the writ of subpoena directed to the Sheriff of Frederick County, against the said Julia E. Hummer, and Joseph E. Hummer, her husband, Dorothy M. C. Stull and Sylvester M. Stull, her husband, who reside in Frederick County Maryland, commanding the same to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed by Your
