Petition:

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a
Court of Equity--

The petition of Albert C. Stettlenyer and Charles E. Stettlenyer, trustees under a
deed of trust executed by W. Hamilton Stettlenyer respectfully shows unto your
Honor--

i.--That on the eighth day of April 1905 the said W. Hamilton Stettlenyer executed
his deed of trust conveying all of his property and estate of every kind and de-
scription unto Susannah Stettlenyer, his wife, in trust for her benefit and sup-
port for and during her natural life, and after her death in trust unto his two sons
Albert C. Stettlenyer and William H. Stettlenyer for certain definite purposes there
in described, which will appear by reference to a certain deed of trust herewith
filed and marked exhibit "A" to this petition.

ii--That on or about April 25 1912 the said William H. Stettlenyer, one of the above
named Trustees, departed this life: that under the provisions of said deed of trust
executed by the said W. Hamilton Stettlenyer the said Charles E. Stettlenyer was ap-
pointed trustee in the place and stead of either or both of said trustees first men-
tioned dying before the decease of their said mother, Susannah Stettlenyer, who de-
parted this life July 16th 1913, the wife of said W. Hamilton Stettlenyer, late of
Frederick County, deceased.

iii--That by the provisions of said deed of Trust your petitioners were authorized
after the death of of the said Susannah Stettlenyer to sell all of said property men-
tioned in said deed of trust either at public or private sale, and out of the pro-
ceeds of sale and monies so collected by converting said property into cash, your pe-
titioners are to pay all just charges and expenses in making said sale, and to the
payment of all just debts including the sum of ten dollars to be paid to said trust-
ees for their services rendered attended the execution of said trust, and to distrib-
ute the residue among the children and grand children of him the said W. Hamilton
Stettlenyer, late of Frederick County, deceased.

iv--That your petitioners have agreed to accept said trust and desire your Honorable
Court to assume jurisdiction of the said trust that the same may be administered
under the direction of Your Honorable Court.

Wherefore your petitioners pray your honorable Court to assume jurisdiction of the
said trust that the same may be administered under the direction of Your Honorable
Court, and that your Honor may fix the bond to be entered unto and given by your
petitioners.

And for such other and further relief as the nature of the cause may require.
And as in duty bound etc.
