COPY OF DEED OF TRUST.

At the request of Susannah Stottlemeyer et. al., the following deed is received for record and recorded May 15th 1905 at 11.15 o'clock A. M.

This deed made this eighth day of April in the year A. D. 1905 by W. Hamilton Stottlemeyer of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, Witnesseth--That whereas I the said W. Hamilton Stottlemeyer, am desirous to make a provision and settlement for my beloved wife, which shall be for her benefit and financial support during the time of her natural life & for the benefit of my legal heirs after her decease--Therefore I the said W. Hamilton Stottlemeyer for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by me, do grant and convey in trust, unto my said beloved wife Susannah Stottlemeyer all of my real estate (which real estate is hereafter more fully described) together with all my personal property whatsoever or wheresoever the same may be found, of which I may be seized and possessed at the time of my decease, for the benefit and support during the remaining portion of her natural life-- And this deed doth also further witness that for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by me, I the said W. Hamilton Stottlemeyer immediately after the decease of my said wife Susannah Stottlemeyer do hereby grant and convey in trust unto my 2 sons, Albert C. and William H. Stottlemeyer all of the above described property both real & personal of which my said beloved wife Susannah Stottlemeyer as trustee may have been seized and possessed at the time of her decease (exclusive of all such portions of said personal property
