REPORT OF SALES.

To the Honorable the Judges of Said Court.

The report of Henry K. DeLauter and Charles McC. Mathias, trustees in the above entitled cause respectfully shows unto Your Honors--

- (1) That pursuant to the requirements of the decretal order passed in this case on the 5th day of December, in the year 1913, the subscribers, the Trustees named in said decree gave bond to the State of Maryland in the penalty designated in said order conditioned in the usual form for the faithful discharge of the duties imposed in them by said decree, which bond was duly approved by the Clerk of this Court and filed as required by law.
- (2) That after giving said bond, the said trustees advertised said property to be sold at public auction as appears by a copy of said advertisement appended to the certificate of purchase herein after referred to.
- (3) That said advertisement was published in the Valley Register, a newspaper printed and circulated in Frederick County, aforesaid and that said advertisement was inserted for the first time on the 12th day of December 1913, and once in each week thereafter, giving full three weeks notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale as described by said decree.
- (4) That on Tuesday January 6th 1914, the subscribers, the trustees attended in front of George Bittle's store in Myersville, Frederick County, Maryland, at the hour of 2 o'clock P. M., that being the place, day and hour named in said advertisement and then and there offered the property described in the proceedings in this cause at public auction, first as two separate parcels and obtained the bid of \$25.00 per acre, on the same. The two parcels were then offered as a whole and said trustees then and there sold the same to Martin L. Shank at and for the sum of one thousand and twenty-seven Dollars, (1027.00) cash to be paid on the ratification of the sale the said Martin L.
