

To Samuel White, colored, I give Twenty-five dollars if living at the time of my daughters death.

And should there be any residue remaining after the payment of all the foregoing bequests in full, I give such residue to the female children of my sister Eve Margaret Schley, share and share alike, and if any of such female children should die leaving children, the child or children of such deceased child shall have its or their mothers share.

It is my will and I so direct that upon the sale of my said house and let my executor hereinafter named shall have the privilege of purchasing the same, if he should so desire, and if the same should be sold at public sale and my executor should be the highest bidder and become the purchaser thereof, he shall be charged with three hundred dollars less than the purchase price, it being my intention that he shall have the refusal of said house and lot at three hundred dollars less than it could be otherwise sold for.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend George W. Cramer to be sole executor of this my last will and testament, revoking all former wills by me made and ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 20th day of November in the year Eighteen Hundred and Eighty five.
