City as the time and place for taking the testimony in this cause and having given
due notice thereof did at the appointed time and place proceed to take the following
testimony to-wit--

William I. Lewis, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff be-
ing duly sworn and examined viva voce, deposes and says as follows--

My name is William F. Lewis, my age 58 years. I reside near Urbana, Frederick
County Maryland. I know all the parties to this cause. I knew E. Dorsey King in
his lifetime. He was my brother-in-law. He married my sister. He is dead and died
intestate on October 19 1940, at his home in Frederick County. He left surviving
him no child, children or descendants, father or mother or brother or sister, but
left the following nieces, being the children of a brother and sister, of the
whole blood, as his heir at law, to-wit--

- (1) Birdie J. Dutrow, who is the wife of Bradley H. Dutrow, both of whom are
adults over 21 years of age. the said Birdie J. Dutrow is the only child of Man-
zella Beall, a deceased sister of the whole blood of the said E. Dorsey King; and
- (2) a niece Mabel S. King, an infant under 21 years of age, and being about 16
years of age. She is the daughter and only child of J. Deall King a deceased
brother of the whole blood of the said E. Dorsey King.

The said E. Dorsey King also left a widow named Mary F. King, who is about sixty
years of age and resides in Frederick County.

I know the real estate of which the said E. Dorsey King died, seized and possessed
consisting of property in Urbana in Frederick County, and which was conveyed to
him by George Wesley Kindley, Trustee, and which is correctly described in Exhibit
