I Priscilla Hammond, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being of sound and disposing memory and understanding, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament, in the manner and form following, that is to say, after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid I devise and bequeath as follows--

I give and bequeath to my granddaughter Henrietta, Stevenson one negro girl named Hellen, Euphemia, age eleven years.

Item. I give and devise to my grand daughter Susan R. Stevenson, one negro girl named Ann Elizabeth, aged twelve years.

Item. I devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my real and personal estate of every description to my son Dawson V. Hammond, except my negro woman, Serena, about 40 years of age, whom it is my desire shall be free at my decease.

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my son Dawson V. Hammond to be executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other, to be my last will and testament.

In witness and testimony whereof I have herunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22nd day of January in the year of Our Lord eighteen hundred and forty eight.
