

Trustee to James Cornelius, made on the 9th day of May 1906 and recorded in liber S. T. H. No. 274 folio 516&co., one of the land records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which is herewith filed marked Exhibit D., and which it prayed to be made part hereof as if fully set forth in words and figures, as well as all the other exhibits filed herewith.

4. That administration of all and singular the personal estate of the said James Cornelius has lately been granted to one Carroll H. B. Strailman who in virtue thereof has possessed himself of the said personal estate of the said James Cornelius herewith filed as part hereof and marked exhibit E.

5. That your orator is informed and believes that said personal estate is not sufficient to discharge all the just debts due and owing by the said intestate, James Cornelius, at the time of his death, but he is advised that the same now in the hands of the said administrator might be applied to the claim of your orator and other creditors of the said James Cornelius as far as the same will extend; and that any deficiency in said personal estate ought to be supplied by a sale of all, or such part as may be necessary, of the real estate of the aforesaid debtor.

To the end therefore--

That the said real estate of the said James Cornelius, deceased, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, may be sold for the payment of so much of the aforesaid debts as may remain after the application of the personal estate aforesaid.

That your orator may have such other and further relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your orator the order of publication giving notice to the said Charles Cornelius and Charlotte Cornelius his wife, both of the State of West Virginia, as aforesaid, and to the said Anna P. Cornelius an infant non-resident of the State of Maryland, of the object and substance of said bill, and warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before a certain day, to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed, and also the writ of subpoena directed to the said Carroll H. B. Strailman, administrator, as aforesaid, and to the said Nellie Cornelius, Lewis Cornelius, and Daisy Cornelius, his wife, Lula Strailman and Carroll H. B. Strailman, her husband, Harry Cornelius Grover C. Cornelius and Mildred Cornelius, all of whom reside in Frederick County as aforesaid, commanding them and each of them to be and appear, either in person or by solicitor, in this Court on or before a certain day to be named therein to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
