At the request of James Cornelius the following deed is received for record and recorded May 31 1906 at 12.05 o'clock P. M.

This deed made this 9th day of May in the year nineteen hundred and six, by Charles Selden, Jr., Trustee in Bankrupt, Witnesseth--Whereas James Cornelius of Brunswick, Frederick County, Maryland, was on the 16th day of July 1901 adjudged a bankrupt debtor in the United States District Court for the District of Maryland and Charles Selden, Jr., was duly appointed his trustee, and said trustee was subsequently by order of Court dated on the 2d day of April 1906 authorized to disclaim title to the hereinafter described real estate of said Bankrupt, and was by said order authorized to transfer by proper deed all, right, title, interest and estate of said James Cornelius, the bankrupt which it is the intention of the end of said Charles Selden, Jr., trustee, by this deed to do. Now therefore in consideration of the above recited premises, and of the sum of five dollars in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I the said Charles Selden, Jr., Trustee in Bankruptcy of James Cornelius, Bankrupt, do hereby grant, convey, transfer unto the said James Cornelius, all right, title interest and estate now vested in me in and to all the following described real estate situated lying and being in the town of Brunswick, Frederick County State of Maryland, to wit--Beginning at a point on the North side of "A" street, fifty (50) feet West of the West side of Ninth Street, and running thence Westerly along the north side of "A" st., fifty feet, thence Northerly parallel to Ninth street one hundred and fifty (150) feet to the South side of a fifteen (15) foot alley; thence Easterly along the South side of said fifteen foot alley (50) feet, thence Southerly parallel to Ninth street one hundred and fifty (150) feet to the place of beginning. Being lot number thirty-two (32) in Block number fifteen (15) as shown on the plat of the Real Estate and Improvement Company's second sub-division of part of Brunswick prepared by R. T. Mavin Surveyor, dated July 24th, 1890, and recorded among the land records of Frederick County, along with the deed from the Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City to Rudolph T. Ault, dated February 2nd 1892, said plat being made herewith a part of this description.
