PUBLICATION OF ADVERT.

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of the real estate of which James Cornelius, late of Frederick County, died, seized and possessed, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to pay the debts of said decedent, after the application of his personal estate.

The Bill is filed in behalf of the plaintiff, and all the other creditors of the said James Cornelius who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, and in substance states that the said James Cornelius was indebted unto the Plaintiff in the sum of \$201.40 on a judgment obtained in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, also upon a judgment for the sum of \$91.72 obtained before Howard M. Jones, a Justice of the Peace of said County, certified copies of which judgments are filed with the Bill and also in the sum of \$69.55 for Sundry matters and things chargeable in account, a copy of which account is also filed with the Bill; that said decedent departed this life on or about the 24th day of October, 1909, intestate, leaving no widow, but leaving the following children and grand children as his heirs at law, viz--Nellie Cornelius, who resides in Brunswick, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and is of full age and unmarried; Lewis Cornelius, who intermarried with Daisy Cornelius, both of whom reside in Brunswick, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and both of whom are of full age; Lulu Strailman, who intermarried with Carrell H. B. Strailman, both of whom reside in Brunswick, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and are of full age; Charles Cornelius who intermarried with Charlette Cornelius, both of whom reside at Ridgely, Mineral County, State of West Virginia, and are of full age; Harry Cornelius, Grever C. Cornelius, and Mildred Cornelius, all of whom reside in Brunswick, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and as infants under twenty one years of age, and are unmarried; and an infant granddaughter, Anna P. Cornelius the daughter of deceased son, Samuel D. Cornelius, who died before his father which said infant is a non-resident of the State of Maryland, and when last heard of was in the State of Pennsylvania; that the said James Cornelius at the time of his death was seized and possessed of a certain house and lot situated in Brunswick, Frederick county Maryland, described in the bill, that letters of administration on his personal estate have been granted to Carrell H. B. Strailman, and that said personal estate is not sufficient to pay all the debts owing by said decedent at the time of his death.

The bill then prays for a decree for the sale of the said real estate or so much thereof as may be necessary for the payment of said debts after the application of the personal estate and for general relief.

It then prays for such process against the resident defendants and an order of publication against the non-resident defendants.
