These respondents answering said Bill answer and state--

1st. That they admit that the said James Cornelius was in his lifetime indebted unto the said Charles R. Gregory, complainant, in the sum of \$201.40 on a judgment obtained in the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, on the 5th day of July, in the year nineteen hundred and six, with interest thereon from the date of said judgment and costs of the suit, as appears from the certified copy of said judgment filed with the Bill; also upon a judgment obtained before Howard M.
