Ans--He was indebted to Mr. Gregory in the amount of two judgments copies of which were filed with the bill as exhibits A- & B and also see open account filed with the Bill as Exhibit C.

5th. Did the said James Cornelius leave any real or personal property at the time of his death, if yes, what and state the value of the same and describe it?

Ans--He left a small amount of personal property which was administered upon by Carrell H. B. Strailman but it was grossly insufficient to pay the debts, and also a house and lot in Brunswick that is described in Exhibit D., filed with the Bill in this case. I look at Exhibit D and think it correctly describes the real estate. This property is worth about \$700.00.

6th.--State whether or not there are any liens on said real estate other than A and B Exhibits?

Ans.--There was a mortgage on the real estate described in Exhibits D., held by the Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City for the amount of \$387.96. It was originally \$600 but was reduced to that amount by payments on it, and which mortgage has been assigned by said Company to Lewis H. Strailman, Lula R. Strailman and Nellie I. Shivers, which mortgage and said assignment are herewith filed as Exhibit "Mortgage."

He owed several other persons but I don't just know their names nor the amounts.

Mrs. Nellie I. Shivers, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the plaintiff having been duly sworn, deposes and says--

My name is Nellie I. Shivers, 28 years of age, reside in Brunswick, Maryland. I am one of the defendants to this suit and knew all the parties thereto.

The decedent James Cornelius, mentioned in this proceeding was my father and he died in October 1909 and left no will. He left no widow. He left children and grand children as his heirs at law, whose names, ages, conditions in life and places of residences are given by the preceding witness, whose testimony I have heard, and all are correct as stated by her. I was summoned in this suit as Nellie Cornelius, but have since married John H. Shivers and we have both filed our answer in this case.

My father at the time of his death was indebted as set forth in the exhibits filed with the Bill in this case and owed several other small bills. He left a small amount of personal property that has been fully administered upon in the Orphans Court for Frederick County, and which was not sufficient to pay his debts. He also left a piece of real estate in Brunswick consisting of a house and lot worth about \$700, and which is correctly described in Exhibit D filed with the Bill.

This property is also subject to a mortgage, the balance due on it being \$387.96, which has been duly assigned by Exhibit "Mortgage" filed with the Examiner.
