The Bill of Complaint of Josephus E. Harley and Mary Harlet, his wife; Robert L. Harley; William
A. Harley and Lizzie E. Harley, his wife; Minnie E. Harley; Margaret Harley; Harriet C. Holter and
Samuel W. Holter, her husband; Julia Summers and Ray Summers, her husband; Lucy Harley and Wil-
lard Harley, all of whom are adult residents of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, re-
spectfully shows--

1st.--That the complainant Josephus E. Harley, together with his brother, Henry T. Harley, the
latter now being deceased, were, at the time of the death of the said Henry T. Harley, seized
and possessed of a certain valuable farm, being part of a tract of land containing 296 acres and
37 square perches of land, more or less, situated, lying and being in Frederick County, in the
State of Maryland, being part of a tract of land called, "The resurvey on Maryland," which was
conveyed unto the said Josephus E. Harley and Henry T. Harley by deed bearing date the 18th day
of November, in the year 1903, executed by Caroline O'Donnell, which by deed has been duly record-
ed among the land records of Frederick County, as will appear by reference to a certified copy
of said deed filed herewith as a part hereof marked "Exhibit A" which it is prayed may be taken
and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

2nd. That the said Henry T. Harley, being seized and possessed of an one-half undivided inter-
est in and to the said land mentioned in Exhibit A departed this life intestate in or about the
month of February, in the year 1911, leaving surviving him no widow and no children or descend-
ants of children but the following collateral relatives as his heirs at law, to-wit--your com-
plainant Josephus E. Harley, a brother whose wife's name is Mary Harley; the children of George
W. T. Harley, a deceased brother of the said Henry T. Harley, as follows--Robert L. Harley, who
is unmarried; William A. Harley, whose wife's name is Lizzie E. Harley; and Minnie E. Harley, who
is also unmarried; also the children of Cornelius Harley, a deceased brother of the said Henry
T. Harley, as follows--Margaret Harley, who is unmarried; Harriet C., who intermarried with Sam-
uel W. Holter; Julia who intermarried with Pauline Harley, all of the aforesaid heirs at law be-
ing residents of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, and all being adults above the age
of twenty-one years except the said Pauline Harley, who is an infant under twenty-one years of
age; also the children of Dr. John Harley, a deceased brother of Henry T. Harley, as follows--
John Harley, whose wife's name is Harley, Lula Harley, who is unmarried; Bertha Har-
ley and Margaret Harley, both of whom are unmarried, and all of whom are adults and reside in
the vicinity of Williamsport, in the State of Pennsylvania; also Mary Ann Willard, a sister of
the said Henry T. Harley, who resides at Eastland, in the State of Texas, and who is an adult
over the age of twenty-one years.
