COURT'S ORDER.

Zimmerman, cestui que trust for life, consenting and praying that the said James Houck may be released and discharged from the further execution of said trust and waiving the Statement of a full and particular account by the said James Houck of his receipts and disbursements as said trustee, it is ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, this 27th day of March A.
