

no personal property sufficient to pay his just debts due to Your orators and divers other persons and that as creditors of the said Scott T. Martin they are entitled to have their claims paid out of the real estate of which the said Scott T. Martin died, seized and possessed.

To the end therefore--

(a) That the real estate of the said Scott T. Martin Deceased, of which he died, seized and possessed, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, may be sold for the payment of the Claims of Your orators and those of the other unsatisfied creditors of said deceased.

(b) That Your orators may have such other and further relief as their case may require.

May it please Your Honors to grant unto your orators the writ of subpoena, directed to the said Adam B. Martin and Alice V. Martin, his wife, Mollie Stotelmeyer and Ira V. Stotelmeyer, her husband, Susan A. Martin, Nellie Martin, Samuel H. Martin and Goldie Martin, his wife, adults, and Edgar Martin, infant and Mary E. Martin widow, all of whom are residents of Frederick County, Maryland, and are adults, excepting the said Edgar Martin who is an infant; Annis Miller and Walter Miller, her husband, Cora Bahtel and Jesse Bahtel, her husband, Sallie Miner and Walter Miner, her husband, all of whom are adults and residents of Washington County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them, to be and appear in this Court on some certain day, to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

This deed made this thirty-first day of March in the year Eighteen hundred and eighty-three by John O. Hays and his wife Catharine S. Hays, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland.

Witnesseth, that in consideration of Two Hundred and Twenty-one dollars and fifty-six cents, the said John O. HAYS and wife do grant unto Scott T. Martin of said County all that piece or parcel of land situated in said County, the same being part of a tract of land called "Good Luck" being also part of the same piece of land which was conveyed unto the said John O. HAYS, by deed from Gideon Bussard and wife, beginning for the part hereby intended to be conveyed at a stone on the West side
