DECREE.

The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill, Answer, Exhibits and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered, It is thereupon this 30th day of August, in the year nineteen hundred and eleven by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that Glenn H. Werthington, and Milton C. Urner, Jr., of Frederick County, be, and they are hereby appointed Trustees to make the said sale and that the course and manner of their proceedings shall be as follows--They shall first file in the Clerk's office of this Court, a bond to the State of Maryland, executed by them with a surety, or sureties, to be approved by the Court, or the Clerk thereof, in the penalty of Five Thousand Dollars, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them by this decree, or which may be reposed in them by an future order, or decree in the premises. They shall then proceed to make sale of the said real estate, having first given at least three weeks previous notice inserted in some newspaper printed in Frederick County, and such other notice as they may think proper of the time, place, manner and terms of
