The Bill of Complaint of Edward B. Riggs, and Susan Riggs, his wife, Ida M. Riggs,  
 Jessie Zimmerman and Spencer C. Zimmerman her husband and Alice C. Crumbaugh and  
 Grayson Crumbaugh, her husband, respectfully shows unto Your Honors--

1st. That Moses Weed, late a resident of Frederick County, departed this life in-  
 testate in the month of November, in the year 1913, seized and possessed of a valu-  
 able farm in Frederick County, Maryland, situated near Mt. Pleasant Hill school  
 house, in Woodshere Election District in said County, containing 158 acres, 2 rods  
 and 21  $\frac{2}{5}$  square perches of land, more or less; and being the same real estate  
 heretofore conveyed unto him the said Moses Weed by Aron Weed, Mary Riggs et. al.,  
 by deed bearing date on the 1st day of April, in the year 1893, and recorded in  
 Liber J. E. J. No. 3 folio 723 &c., one of the land records of Frederick County, a  
 certified copy of which said deed is herewith filed as Exhibit "A" and which to-  
 gether with all other exhibits hereinafter produced, it is prayed may be taken and  
 considered as part of this Bill of Complaint.

2nd. That the said Moses Weed left surviving him as his only heirs at law and his  
 nephews and nieces, the children of his deceased sister Mary, formerly the wife of  
 Plummer I. Riggs, both she the said Mary Riggs and Plummer I. Riggs, her husband,  
 having departed this life prior to the said Moses Weed, leaving the following chil-  
 dren--Charles T. Riggs, whose wife's name is Ida Riggs, both of whom are now resi-  
 dents of Seneca County, State of Ohio, Florence L. Feiser, whose husband's name is  
 Parma L. Feiser, your complainant Edward B. Riggs, whose wife's name is Susan Riggs,  
 Winfield G. Riggs, whose wife's name is Clara Riggs, Amen S. Riggs, whose wife's  
 name is Anna C. Riggs, your complainant Ida M. Riggs, (Unmarried), your complainant  
 Jessie Zimmerman, whose husband's name is Spencer C. Zimmerman, Your complainant  
 Alice C. Crumbaugh, whose husband's name is Grayson Crumbaugh, and Anna C. Cramer,  
 whose husband's name is Grayson Cramer, all of whom reside in Frederick County,  
 State of Maryland; that all of said nieces and nephews and their respective wives  
 and husbands are adults over the age of twenty-one years.

3d. That said real estate of which the said Moses Weed died seized and possessed,  
 and which upon his death intestate descended to his said nephews and nieces above  
 named, is not susceptible of division or partition among the parties thereto en-  
 titled and it would be to the best interest and advantage of all of said parties to  
 have said real estate sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and the proceeds  
 of sale, after the payment of costs and expenses &c., distributed among the parties  
 thereto entitled.
