AGREEMENT OF SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEEDS.

This agreement made this 15th day of May, in the year nineteen hundred and fourteen by and between Edward B. Riggs, Administrator of Moses Wood, deceased, Edward B. Riggs⁵ Ida M. Riggs, Jessie Zimmerman, Alice G. Crumbaugh, Charles T. Riggs, Florence L. Feiser, Winfield G. Riggs and Anna C. Cramer, parties of the first part, and Amon S. Riggs and Anna C. Riggs, his wife, parties of the second part, witnesseth--

Whereas Moses Wood, late of Frederick County, deceased, departed this life seized and possessed of certain real estate and personal property; and Edward B. Riggs has by the Orphans Court for Frederick County been appointed administrator of the estate of said Moses Wood, and has duly qualified and entered upon the discharge of his duties as such; and a bill for the sale of said real estate, for the purposes of partition has been filed in the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity, in No. 9153 Equity in said Court; and the above named parties are all of the heirs at law and next of kin of said Moses Wood; and certain disputes and contentions have arisen between Edgar S. Biggs, administrator as aforesaid, and Amon S. Biggs, in reference to the assets of said estate; and the said Amon S. Riggs and Anna C. Riggs, his wife, either separately or in conjunction with each other, are claiming compensation for certain services alleged to have been rendered said decedent, in his lifetime; and for the purpose of preserving peace and harmony in the family, of compromising said claim, and preventing any further litigation in the settlement of the estate of said Moses Wood, and in the distribution of the proceeds of sale of the real estate of which he died seized the parties hereto have agreed to compromise their differences and effect this family agreement and settlement.

Now therefore it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that the said Amon S. Riggs shall account for and pay over to Edward B. Riggs, administrator of Moses Wood, all sums of money now on deposit in the Woodsboro Savings Bank and the Frederick County National Bank deposited to the credit of Moses Wood and Amon S. Riggs, subject to the order of either, and to account for and pay over all monies received by him the said Amon S. Riggs from the proceeds of the sale of Crops or other articles of personal property which formerly belonged to the said Moses Wood, and
