Whereas by my will dated on the eighth day of November in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, I did bequeath certain specific pecuniary and general residuary legacies to my daughter Elva W. Davis, wife of Joab Davis, and whereas said Joab Davis is now indebted to me, in the sum of Two thousand Three Hundred and seventy dollars, which said debt is secured by mortgage dated on the 27th day of September in the year eighteen hundred and seventy-six, and recorded in Liber T. G. No. 6 folio 131 &c., one of the land records of Frederick County, now I make this a codicil to my last will, hereby revoking so much of the codicil to my will heretofore made by me on the 12th day of July 1875 as refers to the indebtedness of the said Joab Davis to me, and substituting the hereinafter bequest in lieu thereof, as follows, I do will and direct that in case the said indebtedness of the said Joab Davis to me shall not be paid to me before my death, or any part thereof shall remain due and owing to me at my death, then in that event, I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter Elva W. Davis, the said Mortgage debt, and the Mortgage given to secure the same and that the said Mortgage debt hereby intended bequeathed shall form and constitute part of the legacy heretofore bequeathed to my said daughter, by my said last will and testament, but in case the said mortgage debt is paid to me by the said Joab Davis, then I hereby ratify and confirm the legacy heretofore devised by my said last will and testament the same as if herein inserted and bequeathed again.
