I Elviby W. davis the wife of Joab W. Davis of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland being in good health and of sound and disposing mind and memory and understanding mindful of the uncertainty of death and of the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs before it shall please Almighty God to call me hence do therefore make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First and principally I commit my body to the earth to be decently buried in the discretion of my executor and after my just debts and funeral expenses are paid I give and devise as follows--

I give devise and bequeath to my daughter Hepsea E. Smith the mortgage debt now due and owing to me by my husband Husband, Joab W. davis, which said mortgage bears date January 4 1888, together with all interest due or which may become due upon the same; provided however, and upon the express condition, that should my husband survive me the said hepsea E. Smith, is not to charge or exact or collect from my said Husband any interest on said mortgage debt from my death until his death so long as he shall use said farm in said mortgage mentioned, nor during the life of said Joab W. Davis my husband, shall said Hepsea E. Smith foreclose or collect or sell said mortgage.
