My name is Edward E. Adams, I am 58 years of age. I reside in New Market this county and I know the parties to this cause. Mrs. Anna^W Hughes died in November 1907, and her husband Edward Hughes died out in Kansas last February. Mrs. Anna W. Hughes left no will that I ever heard of. Mr. and Mrs. Hughes never had any children. She did have some brothers whose names are as follows--Jesse J. Plummer, whose wife's name is Edith May Plummer, in New Jersey; Samuel W. Plummer and his wife's name is Mollie E. J. Plummer, they live in Frederick County, Maryland; Charles Plummer who is a widower and unmarried & lives somewhere in the West. All of the above are adults and over 60 years of age. Mrs. Hughes at the time she died owned about 45 or 50 acres of land lying along the road on the East side between New Market and Monrovia, adjoining the land of Charles Turnbull, J. Calvin Walker and Lewis O. Willis. This land has a dwelling house and a small stable in need of repairs. This land is worth about \$3500. This land cannot be divided among the parties in interest without loss and injury and it would be to the best interest of all concerned to sell it and divide the proceeds.
