Ridenbaugh, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, sold to satisfy the debts due and owing by the said Samuel S. Ridenbaugh.

Wherefore your orators pray for the following relief--

1. That the said Claims of your orators, and each of them, may be allowed by Your Honorable Court
2. That the said real estate of the said Samuel S. Ridenbaugh, deceased, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose may be sold for the payment of the debts of the said Samuel S. Ridenbaugh.
3. That Your orators may have such further and other relief as the nature of the case may require

And your orators pray for the following process--

That a subpoena may issue out of Your Honorable Court summoning the said Stella potts, administratrix, etc., as aforesaid, and the said "Sissy" Ridenbaugh, lunatic etc., as aforesaid, and each of them to appear in Your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named in said writ, answer the premises, abide by and perform such a decree as may be passed therein.
