Q. Where did you live?

A. I lived in Charles Wenner's house about 7 months.

Q. How far is that from his restaurant?

A. A good piece.

Q. One half a mile?

A. yes sir.

Q. How do you know what was going on at the restaurant at that time?

A. I don't know then.

Re-direct examination.

Q. Do you know when his mother died?

Q. Was it a couple years before he died?

A. Yes sir it was.

Q. You said Mr. Bond went away twice during 14 years?

A. Yes sir.

Q. Do you know how long he was away each time?

A. The first time not so terrible long I do not know the second time.

Q. About how long the first time?

A. I do not believe over two months.

Q. How long the second time?

A. I cannot answer that question, I do not know.

Q. Was it longer than two months?

A. I don't know,

Q. You said You lived in Wenner ^{the} house 7 months?

A. yes sir.

Q. And then you moved in the Hudson property?

A. I moved there in 1894. In 1904 I moved to Knoxville, and then moved back to Wenner's house.

Q. How long were you in Knoxville?

A. A little over a year.

Q. Were you 7 months in the Wenner house?

A. yes sir, and then I moved to Mr. Hudson's house.

Q. from 1906 when you moved back to the Hudson property you lived next floor to the restaurant.

A. Yes sir

Q. Did you live there continuously until Mr. Ridenbaugh died?

A. yes sir.
