

## Cross Examination--

 Q. What work would he be doing?  
 A. Everything connected with that kind of work, scrub, sweep, serve meals and further more he had to take that interest in the busjness.  
 Q. Why did he have to take such an interest?  
 A. Because he was a good clean man, he wouls not allow anybody around him that was not clean, and Charlie Bond would take great interest in his place, i have heard many persons remark about how he cared for the place, and i seen it myself.
