(b) And that for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.

And Your complainants pray Your Honors that the writ of Subpoena may be issued directed to the Sheriff of Frederick County, against Hepsie E. Etchison, residing at Kemp-town, Frederick County, Maryland, Hepsie E. Etchison, assignee of Mortgage, and the Mt. Olivet cemetery Company a body corporate; and to the Sheriff of Carroll County State of Maryland, against Joab W. Davis, jr., who is an inmate at the Sykesville asylum, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in Your Honorable Court on some day to be named therein and answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed in therein.

May it please Your Honors to grant unto your Complainants an order of publication giving notice to Alfred Davis and Louisa Davis, his wife, and Grover C. Davis all of the State of Indiana aforesaid, who are non-residents of this State, of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before a certain day to be named therein, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.

EXHIBIT A.

At the request of Joab W. Davis, the following deed was recorded Oct. 7th 1867.

This deed made this seventh day of October, in the year A. D. eighteen hundred and sixth seven, by John T. Worthington and Mary Worthington, his wife, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland of the one part and Joab W. Davis, of the same county & State aforesaid of the other part.

Witnesseth, that the said John T. Worthington and Mary Worthington his wife for the consideration of Four Thousand three Hundred & seven Dollars & Twenty-five cents, current money to them in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do grant in fee simple unto the said Joab W. Davis all that piece or parcel of land situated in Frederick County, State of Maryland called the Resurvey on "Daniel Small Tract," Beginning for the part hereby conveyed at a stone standing in the Northern margin of Bennett Creek, it being also the beginning of a tract of land called "Lost and Found" and running thence North twenty-two and a half degrees East eleven perches to a stake, then North twenty-eight and a half degrees East twenty-four and three tenths perches to a stake, then North thirty-four and a quarter degrees West forty perches to a marked black oak tree then north twenty degrees, west forty two perches, then North sixty seven and a half degrees West thirty-five and a half perches to the end of a sixth line of S. G. Coxkey's part of said land and with said Coxkey's part North thirty-seven degrees East forty-four and eight tenths perches, North one and a half degrees east twelve and a half perches, North fifty-seven degrees West sixty-eight perches to the Western margin of the public road leading from Urbana to New Market then with said road north fifty-five degrees East thirty-eight and one half perches to the original divisional line between Thomas Worthington and Nicholas Worthington and with said line reversed South seventy-three and three quarters degrees east one hundred and fifty six and a half perches to a large stone then with a straight line to the beginning, containing one hundred and even acres two roods and twenty nine square perches of land more or less And the said John T. Worthington and Mary Worthington his wife covenant that they
