4. And when did she die?

A. February 21 1914.

5. State the names of those surviving her as her heirs at law?

A. Charles S. Woodcock, her husband, and the following children, Mary E. Flora, whose husband's name is L. Clifton Flora, William J. Woodcock, whose wife's name is Rosal L. Woodcock, Allen T. Woodcock, unmarried, all adults, Charles R. Woodcock aged 20 years, Carol S. Woodcock, aged 16 years, all residents of Frederick County, Maryland, excepting Allen T. Woodcock, who is a non-resident of the State of Maryland, and who lives somewhere in the State of Washington.

6. State whether or not your mother left a will?

A. Yes sir, she left a will.

7. Look at Exhibit D. handed you and state whether or not this is a copy of the last will and testament of your mother, the said Sarah E. Woodcock?

A. Yes sir, this is a copy.

8. State whether or not Mrs. Woodcock left any personal estate, and if so to what amount?

A. No sir not that I know of.

9. State if you know whether any letters testamentary or of administration were granted on your mother's estate.

A. No sir.

10. Look at Exhibit C and State what it is?

A. It is a copy of the deed made to my mother.

11. State whether or not your mother was seized and possessed of this real estate or the real estate described in this deed at the time of her death and whether she was still the owner of it?

A. She was still the owner of it.

12. State the value of this property?

A. About one thousand dollars.

Cross examination by Mr. Newman--

1. Mrs. Flora, your name before your marriage was Mary E. Woodcock, was it not?

A. Yes sir.

2. Did you not before delivery the deed in connection with your Father execute a mortgage to The Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore, in order to secure a loan of \$599.986

A. Yes sir, and there is still a balance due on this mortgage of \$331.24 with interest from July 31st, 1914.

3. Look at this note marked Exhibit B and State whose signature it is?

A. It is my mother's signature.

4. To the general interrogatory?

A. No sir.
