

ed by a trustee or trustees to be appointed by a further order or decree of Your Honorable Court in the premises, so that the net proceeds arising from said sale will enure to the benefit of Your oratrix, Ellen Trail Legg, for and during the time of her natural life, and after her death unto your orators, being all of the children of said Ellen Trail Legg, or unto the personal representatives or assigns of the children of said Ellen Trail Legg in like manner as said real estate sold would have ultimately inured or vested under the terms of the devise as contained in the last will and testament of George F. Webster, Exhibit A as filed with this Bill of Complaint.

2. That Your Honor will order and direct said trustee when so appointed to sell said Real estate at private sale unto said Charles W. Zimmerman for the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars and upon the terms as set forth in Exhibit G, filed herewith as a part hereof.

3. And for such other and further relief to which your orators may be entitled, and as unto your orators will seem to be just and equitable in the premises.

May it please Your Honors to grant unto Your Orators the writ of subpoena directed unto the said defendants, Chaunsey Morge Legg, an infant residing with Your oratrix Ellen Trail Legg, in Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland, John C. Legg who is also a resident of Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland, and unto the Fidelity and Deposit Company, of Maryland, a corporation located with its principal office in Baltimore City, in the State of Maryland, commanding them and each of them to appear in Your Honorable Court on some certain day to be named in said writ, and to answer the premises, and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed by Your Honors therein.
