

Benjamin Rosenour, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Plaintiffs, being first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows--

Q. State your name, age, residence and occupation?

A. Benjamin Rosenour, witness of lawful age,; residence, Frederick, Maryland; occupation member of the firm of B. Rosenbur & Sons.

Q. State whether or not your firm is a judgment creditor of C. Herbert Thomas, and to what amount?

A. They are, to the amount of \$29.75.

Q. The proceedings instituted in this case is for the sale of a certain piece or parcel of land situated in Urbana District, Frederick County, Maryland, in which C. herbert Thomas is interested as distributee. State whether or not your firm is willing that your judgment shall become a lien on the proceeds of sale to the same extent that your lien now is on the real estate itself, if sold

A. I am willing that the property be sold and the proceeds divided, provided my judgment is the same lien against the proceeds of sale as it is against the real estate itself.

A. Atlee Radoliff, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Plaintiffs, being first duly sworn deposes and says as follows--

Q. State your name, age, residence and occupation.

A. Atlee Radoliff, 33 years of age, residence Frederick Maryland, occupation dentist.

Q. Will you state whether or not you are a judgment creditor of C. Herbert Thomas, one of the defendants in this case, and if so for what amount.

A. Yes, sir. I am, and the amount is \$251.46 with interest and costs, as shown by the certified copy filed in these proceedings.

Q. The proceedings in this case were instituted on behalf of J. Fenton Thomas, jr., and others against Anna Mary Thomas, widow, and others, for the sale of a certain farm in Frederick County in which C. Herbert Thomas is interested and against whose interest your judgment is now a lien of record. The object of this proceeding is to convert the said real estate into cash and distribute the proceeds of sale among the parties entitled. State whether you are willing for said real estate to be sold clear and discharged of this lien, taking the same lien against C. Herbert Thomas' proceeds of sale as you now have against his interest in the real estate.

A. No I am not.

To the general interrogatory.

A. Nothing further.
