Bertie Nicodemus and J. Fenton Thomas, of Frederick County, Md., in consideration of the execution of these presents have agreed to endorse promissory notes to the Amount of Five Thousand Dollars \$5,000.00, for the accommodation of the said Bernard W. Thomas, and to renew ^{said} endorsements from time to time, whenever requested, by the said Bernard W. Thomas, within the limit of Five Thousand Dollars during a period of Four years from the date of these presents, Now therefore this assignment witnesseth that in consideration of the premises the said Bernard W. Thomas, deceased, wife of J. Fenton Thomas also all my right, title and interest in any benefit that may accrue from the estate of Anna Mary Thomas of Frederick County, Md.

Provided that if the said Bernard W. Thomas shall pay or cause to be paid the said promissory note at or before maturity, so that the said endorser shall be protected from all liability thereon, then this assignment to be void also should the amount derived from said estates exceed the aforesaid sum together with accrued interest, it is agreed that after the satisfaction of said notes, the balance to be paid to the said Bernard W. Thomas.
