2. That the proceeds of sale after the payment of costs and expenses, be divided and distributed among the parties thereto entitled, in accordance with their several and respective interests therein, and that the said S. Raymond Senseney be excluded from participating in the distribution thereof.

3. That your orators may have such other and further relief as the case may require.

That the writ of subpoena may be issued in the usual form out of Your Honorable Court against the said Nellie Sappington, infant, Cora Sappington, infant, Anne Sappington, infant, Carrie Sappington, infant and S. Raymond Senseney, commanding them and each of them, to be and appear in this Court on some certain day to be named in said writ to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.
