TO the Honorable the Judges of the said Court-

Your orators and oratrices complaining says--

1. That John Wm. Burrier, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, was in his lifetime and at the time of his death, seized and possessed, in fee simple of several tracts, lots and parcels of real estate, situate, lying and being in Mt. Pleasant District, Frederick County, Maryland, whioh said tracts, lots and parcels of land were conveyed to the said John Wm. Burrier, by the following deeds towit--
 - A. All that tract and real estate which was conveyed unto John W. Burrier by a deed from Elizabeth Derr, et. al., dated the 19th day of May 1875 an recorded in liber T. G. No. 4 folio 614, 615 and 616 etc., one of te land records for Frederick County and containing 20 acres, 2 roods and 6 square perches of land, more or less.
 2. All that tract and parcel of land that was conveyed to John W. Burrier by E. L. Derr, trustee, by a deed dated the 29th day of April, 1878, and recorded in liber T.G. No. 10 folio 471, etc., one of the land records for Frederick County and containing 11 acres, 3 roods and 33 square perches of land.
 - C. All that tract and parcel of land that was conveyed to said John W. Burrier by a deed from Edward A. Shriner bearing date the 12th of JAnuary 1883 and which said deed is recorded in liber A. F. NO. 7, folio 527 one of the land records for Frederick county, said tract and parcel of land containing 11 axres, 1 rood and 38 square perches of land.
 - D. All that tract and parcel of land that was conveyed unto the said John W. Burrier (as J. William Burrier) by deed from William A. Cramer, said ded bearing date 23rd day of December 1890, an which said deed is duly recorded in liber W. I. P. No. 11, folio 690, one of the land records for Frederick County, said tract containing $35\frac{3}{4}$ acres of land, more or less.
 - E. All that tract and parcel of land that was conveyed unto the said John W. Burrier (as J. William Burrier) by deed from William A. Cramer said ded bearing date of the 7th day of June 1892 and which said ded is duly recorded in liber J. L. J. No.1, folio 748 one of the land records for Frederick County, said tract and parcel of land containing $6\frac{1}{2}$ asres of land more or less; certified copies of said deeds for said tracts and parcels of land being herewith filed as Exhibits Nos. A. B. C. D. E. respectively, and which together with all other exhibits are prayed to be taken and considred as part hereof by Your Honorable Court.
2. That being so seized and possessed of the said real estate, the said John Wm. Burrier departed this life on or about the 28th day of May 1906, intestate, leaving a widow, Mary C. Burrier, one of Your Oratrices and the following named childred, heirs at law and descendants, to whom as heirs at law, the said lands have descended, viz--
