In pursuance of the annexed order of the Court and notice given me by the solicitor for the Plaintiffs, I Clayton O. Keady, one of the standing Examiners of said Court, duly appointed, qualified and sworn, having assigned the 11th day of January A. D. 1915, as the time for taking the testimony in the cause, at the office of D. P. Buckey Esq., in Frederick Md., and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned and at the appointed time and place proceeded to take the following testimony, to-wit-- The Plaintiffs filed with the Examiner as evidence Exhibits A. B. C. D. E. & F. which are herewith returned by the said Examiner.

John E. Burrier, a witness of lawful age, procured on the part of the Plaintiffs being duly sworn and examined viva voce, deposes and says as follows--

My name is John E. Burrier, my age is 38 years. I reside in Frederick County, I am one of the Plaintiffs in this case. I know all the parties in this case.

I knew John W. Burrier late of Frederick County. He was my father. He is dead. He died without a will at his home in Frederick County on May 28th 1906.

At the time of his death he was seized and possessed of five parcels of land all lying contiguous to one another in Mt. Pleasant District, in Frederick County containing in the aggregate about 86 acres and 37 square perches of land more or less. This land was conveyed to him by the deeds certified copies of which are herewith filed marked Exhibits A. B. C. D. and E. which fully describe said real estate. They constitute a farm with one set of buildings on it and are worth about \$50 per acre.

At the time of his death the said John Wm. Burrier, left a widow named Mary C. Burrier who is now aged 70 years and resides in Frederick County and who has by a paper written herewith filed as Exhibit F., consented to take such sum of money as she may be allowed in lieu of her right of dower therein, and the following children as her heirs at law--

1. John E. Burrier (present witness) unmarried.
2. William H. Burrier, unmarried.
