In the Name of GOD, Amen. I Thos. S. Lee, Testator of Frederick County, State of Maryland, being sick & weak in body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time whereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence do therefore, make make and publish my last will and testament in the manner and form following that is to say--

First and principally--

I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors. After my debts and funeral expenses are paid, I give and devise unto Columbus O. D. Lee my son, my plantation whereon I live by name Needwood containing two hundred acres more or less, to the said Columbus and his heirs and assigns in fee simple, the said land being subject to a ground rent given by me to late Columbus O'Donnell of four hundred dollars--

I also give and devise unto said Columbus O'D. Lee, all the household furniture, also of kitchen I also give and devise to said Columbus O'D. Lee, every article of every kind nevertheless, to my son Chas. O'D. Lee I give all the furniture contained in the South East bed room opposite my room called the Company room I give and devise to said Chas. O'D. Lee the choice of my two horse carriages also the oil painting of my sister M. D. Gouverneur lately deceased- I also give and devise to my daughter E. M. Lee, wife of my son Doct. Wm. Lee deceased, the contents of bed room on the North East corner, next to the Company Room I also give to my granddaughter Ellen Lynch Lee the portrait of her Aunt Mrs. Ellen Lynch Lee after whom she takes her name- To my son Columbus O'D. Lee I further give and devise all the carriages, wagons horses & cattle for his property. I here direct and devise to my son Chas. O'D. Lee the division of the silver & plated ware to divide into to three equal shares in value the coffee set to be given the option.

to my son Columbus O'D. Lee to have as his share nevertheless all of my children shall have equal shares in weight or any deficiency made up in money value--per ~~or~~ the coffee set is composed of coffee, tea & water pot, also water kettle- sugar-dish-cream & slop bold I give & devise my watch and chain to my grand son Thos. S. Lee.

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Chas. O'D. Lee to be my sole executor of this my last will and testament- revoeking and annuling all wills heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and no other.
