To the Honorable Judges of said Court--

The petition of William D. Barrick, respectfully represents unto Your Honorable Court--

1. That David M. Barrick, late of Frederick County, deceased, by his last will and testament, bearing date December 12th 1914, and recorded among the records for the recording of wills in the office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County, a certified copy of which is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 1, to this petition, which together with all other exhibits your petitioner prays may be taken and considered as a part hereof, said will contains the following paragraph to-wit--"I give and bequeath unto my said son William D. Barrick, all the rest and residue of my estate real, personal and mixed, to have and to hold during his natural life only, and at his death to be equally divided among the wife and children of my said son, William T. Barrick in equal portions share and share alike."

2. That the said David Barrick left real estate to the value of about \$20,000 and personal property of the value, after the payment of all debts and administration thereof, of about \$25,000.

3. That your petitioner is advised and so charges that it is necessary under the terms of said last will and testament, that a trustee should be appointed to take charge of and administer said trust fund, estate and property under the guidance and direction of Your Honorable Court.

To the end therefore--

1. That Your Honorable Court may assume jurisdiction in the premises and appoint some suitable person trustee to take charge of and administer said trust fund, estate and property, under the guidance and direction of Your Honorable Court.

2. And for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

EXHIBIT NO. 1.

I, David M. Barrick of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, being of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, do hereby make, publish and declare this, my last will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say--

I give and bequeath unto my son, William D. Barrick, all of my live stock and farming implements of every description that may be on the farm where my said son resides, at the time of my death in fee simple.

I give and bequeath unto the Comistory of the Reformed church in Walkersville, Frederick County, Maryland, my weekly deposits in the Walkersville Savings Bank of Frederick County Maryland, my stock in the Berlin and Lovettsville Bridge Company, and my stock in the Walkersville Water Company, all in trust, and the dividends or incomes from the Bridge Company and the Water Company stock to be paid annually for the care and upkeep of the Glade Cemetery, near Walkersville.

I give and bequeath unto my said son, William D. Barrick, all the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal and mixed, to have and to hold during his natural life only, and at his death to be equally divided among the wife and children of my said son, William D. Barrick, in equal portions, share and share alike.

provided, however, that in the event my said son should be desirous of owning my farm situated in Mt. Pleasant District, containing one hundred and sixty-six acres of land more or less, and now in the tenancy of George A. Benner, I hereby bequeath said farm to my said son upon the following condition, namely, upon the payment of the sum of Eight Thousand dollars, said sum to be secured by a first mortgage on said farm, or in some other approved manner, and to bear interest at the rate
