To The Honorable Judges of said Court--

The Woodsboro Savings Bank, of Frederick County, Maryland, and James M. Smith, who sues for themselves as well as on behalf of all other creditors who come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, complaining say--

1. That a certain George DeWitt Barrick, departed this life on or about the 10th day of June, in the year A. D. 1914, intestate, being indebted at the time of his death to complainant, the Woodsboro Savings Bank of Frederick County, Maryland, in the sum of \$2100. by his Judgment debt bearing date April 6 1910, a certified copy of which judgment is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 1, which together with all other Exhibits complainant prays may be taken and considered as part hereof; being also indebted to complainant, James M. Smith, by its Judgment dated August 8th 1912, in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, a certified copy of which is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 2; and being further indebted unto the said James M. Smith, in the sum of \$505. being a Judgment dated November 21st, 1913, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 3, and being further indebted unto the said James M. Smith in the sum of \$218.95 by his open account, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 4.
2. That the personal property, if any left by the said George DeWitt Barrick, is small and entirely inadequate to meet the indebtedness represented by said Exhibits Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 aforesaid.
3. That said George DeWitt Barrick was seized in fee simple at the time of his death of several tracts or parcels of land, situated in Woodsboro District, Frederick County, Maryland, which will be found fully described in a certain deed from A. E. Etzler and wife to the said George DeWitt Barrick, and Catherine E. Barrick, his wife, recorded in liber H. W. B. No. 292, folio 117, and 118 a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 5, to this Bill of Complaint (the said Catherine E. Barrick, wife of the said George D. Barrick having died several years ago, whereupon the said George DeWitt Barrick became seized of the whole title to the property described in said deed by right of survivorship, less however, the portion sold therefrom by the said George DeWitt Barrick to W. B. Cutshall by deed duly recorded in liber H. W. B. No. 304 folio 355 one of the land records for Frederick County, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 6, to this Bill of Complaint.
4. That the said George DeWitt Barrick left surviving him an adult daughter, Mae Barrick as only child and sole heir at law, in whom the title to the real estate hereinbefore described vested upon the death of the said George DeWitt Barrick, in fee simple subject to the debts due and owing at the time of his death.

To the end therefore--

1. That an account may be taken under the direction of this Court of the said debts so aforesaid due to this complainant and of all other debts which were owing by said intestate at the time of his death, and which still remains unpaid and also of the personal estate and effects of the said intestate if any left by him.
2. That the said real estate of the said George DeWitt Barrick deceased or so much
