P E T I T I O N .

The Petition of William H. Layman respectfully shows unto your Honors:-

- (1) That the said William H. Layman was the purchaser of the property mentioned in the above entitled matter and sold on May the 15th by Frank L. Stoner and Charles McC. Mathias, Trustees appointed by your Honorable Court.
- (2) That the terms and conditions of said sale as announced by said Trustees on the day of sale are a matter of record in your Honorable Court and are now pending in the matter of a petition heretofore filed, to-wit: June 18th 1915.
- (3) That in defiance of the terms and conditions as your Petitioner understands them, the present occupants of the property, to-wit: the Misses Sevilla and Rosa Layman, have cultivated and are about to plant other portions of the farm in millet or other grains than was contemplated in the terms and conditions of sale.
- (4) That said planting if carried out will result in irreparable loss and damage to your petitioner as the purchaser of said property.
- (5) That your petitioner has protested against the course pursued by the present occupants of the property, but they in defiance of his protest and in defiance of the Court's Order heretofore served on them, to-wit: June 19th, 1915, are proceeding to cast said crop as heretofore set forth and that unless restrained by your Honorable Court, said planting will result in irreparable loss and injury as aforesaid.

W H E R E F O R E your Petitioner prays that an injunction be issued restraining the said occupants of said property, to-wit: Misses Sevilla and Rosa Layman, their agents or servants, from casting said crop and from further continuing the cultivation of said farm other than set forth in the petition filed before your Honors on June 18th, 1915.
