To the Honorable the Judges of said Court!:-

The answer of Sevilla Layman and Rosa Layman to the petition exhibited in the above entitled cause, and the order of your Honorable Court passed on the July 1st, 1915, respectfully shows unto your Honors!

1. These respondents in answering said petition filed against them in this cause aver that they had no knowledge of any injunction being granted by your Honorable Court, at the time they continued to plant corn after said paper was served on them. However after the Sheriff had left and four rounds had been made, these respondents read said paper writing and then it was discovered that they were restrained from planting any more corn, and these respondents say that they have not violated the order of your Honorable Court, only that they did not plant eight rows of corn, making four rounds with the corn planter, and had these respondents know the contents of the paper served on them on June 25th, 1915 by the Sheriff of Frederick County, they would not have made these four rounds with the planter,

In further answering said petition these respondents say that William H. Layman has grossly misrepresented the whole matter to your Honorable Court, and which will clearly appear when said cause comes on to be heard! That the said William H. Layman petitioner having obtained from your Honorable Court an injunction has caused these respondents great loss and damage as there yet remains to be planted about four acres of corn according to the terms of sale as announced on the day of sale of said farm; that these respondents have always stood ready and still stand ready to obey every order of your Honorable Court, and in order that their rights may be ascertained, these respondents desire to be heard as to the matters and things contained in the petition of June 18th, the petition of June 25th and also as to the matters and things contained in the petition of July 1st, 1915. Wherefor your respondents pray your Honorable Court to allow them to be heard in the whole matter at as early a date as possible so that they may be in a position to properly look after their crops, and that the Court may that they have in no way violated intentionally any order passed by your Honorable Court.
