The Bill of Complaint of John C. Lamar and Hattie A. Lamar, his wife, and George A. Lamar of Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland, respectfully shows unto your Honors;

(1) That Mary C. Lamar, late of Frederick County, but now deceased, was in her lifetime and at the time of her death seized and possessed of a piece or parcel of land, situated, lying and being in Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland, and more particularly described in a deed from Daniel Rhodes, et al. dated on the 10th day of March, A.D. 1860, and recorded in Liber B.G.F. No. 5, folio 323, one of the land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit A, and which together with all other Exhibits filed herewith, it is prayed may be taken and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

(2) That the said Mary C. Lamar, being seized and possessed as aforesaid, departed this life intestate on or about the _____ day of _____, 1889, leaving surviving her the following children and heirs at law, to-wit: Marion T. Lamar, a son, whose wife's name is Lizzie Wood Lamar; George A. Lamar, a son, who is unmarried, and resides in Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland; Annie Lamar Bready, a daughter, who intermarried with Edward T. Bready, and John C.
