Bowers, a daughter, who intermarried with Scott Bowers, and who resides in Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland; and Marrion T. Lamar, a son, whose wife's name is _____ Lamar, who resides in Cumberland, Allegany County, Maryland; Holmes Lamar, a son, whose wife's name is _____ Lamar, who lives in the City of Baltimore, State of Maryland, and Bruce Lamar, a son, who is unmarried, of the City of Pittsburg, State of Pennsylvania.

(4) That since the death of the said Mary C. Lamar as aforesaid, the said Annie Lamar Bready has also departed this life, leaving surviving her a husband, Edward T. Bready, who lives in Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland; Clarence Bready, a son, who has been absent and unheard of for twelve years; Beulah Bready, a daughter, who is unmarried, and resides in Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland; Lamar Bready, a son, whose wife's name is _____ Bready, who lives at Keyser, West Virginia; Grace L. Cox, a daughter, who has since departed this life, leaving surviving her a husband, John Cox, and a minor son, John Edward Cox, who resides with his father in Louisburg, West Virginia; Nellie Bready Fair, a daughter, who intermarried with Charles Fair and who lives in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania; Julia Anthony, a daughter, who intermarried with one _____ Anthony, and who resides in Greensboro, North Carolina, and Eva Bready, unmarried, who lives in Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland.

(5) That since the death of the said Mary C. Lamar, the property herein mentioned was deeded by the said John C. Lamar, George A. Lamar and Marion T. Lamar unto their sister, Annie L. Bready, to have and to hold the same for and during her natural life and no longer, as will more fully appear by reference to the deed dated the 10th day of July, A.D. 1889, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit "B", and intended to be taken and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

(6) Your complainants further state that the said Annie M. Bready has since departed this life as aforesaid, and that the said property herein mentioned is not susceptible of division among the parties thereunto entitled without great loss and injury, and that it would be to the best interest and advantage of all parties concerned, and especially the infant Defendants, that the property be sold and the proceeds distributed among the parties entitled thereto under the direction of your Honorable Court. TO THE END THEREOF;

That the property mentioned in this Bill of Complaint may be sold by a Trustee to be appointed by your Honorable Court, and the proceeds thereof to be distributed among the parties entitled thereto under the direction of your Honorable Court; And for such and further relief as the nature and equity of the case may require.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONORS to grant unto your Complainants the writ of subpoena in the usual form against the said Lizzie Wood Lamar, widow of Marion T. Lamar; Marion T. Lamar and _____ Lamar, his wife, of Cumberland, Alleghany County, Maryland, Holmes Lamar and _____ Lamar, his wife, of Baltimore City, Maryland; Edward T. Bready, Beulah Bready and Eva Bready, all of whom reside in the neighborhood of Adamstown, Frederick County, Maryland, Oliver Snyder, Bernice Snyder and _____ Snyder infant and _____ Snyder, infant Blanche L. Bowers and Scott Bowers, her husband, of Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be
