

FIRST. That a certain Joseph Wood of Frederick County, in the State aforesaid, was on the 25th, day of January A.D. 1881 by Your Honorable Court Appointed Trustee to Execute the Trust in the proceedings mentioned, and shortly thereafter executed a bond to the State of Maryland for the faithful discharge of his trust, all of which appears by the proceedings had in the above entitled cause in which this petition is filed and prayed may be taken and considered as a part thereof, SECONDLY, That the said Joseph Wood Trustee aforesaid in the execution of his trust has come into possession of large sums of money appertaining to said Trust, and from the date of his appointment to the present time has never rendered to this Court any account of the execution of his said Trust as was his duty to do.

For such other and further relief as he may be in Equity entitled to, or his case may require and as in duty bound he will ever pray &c,
