Answer of Joseph Wood Trustee to Petition and Court's Order

(1) The answer of Joseph Wood Trustee in the above entitled cause Respectfully shows unto your Honorable Court that he was appointed Trustee at the earnest Solicitation of Vernon W. Dorsey the cestui que Trust. (2) That he has faithfully and Honestly performed his duties as such and paid the income properly and regularly to said verson W. Dorsey and frequently paid the same in advance, and that the said Trust estate is now indebted to this Trustee for a considerable sum of money advanced by him to pay taxes and purchase fertiliser and seed wheat to sow out the crop on the trust Estate and for money advanced to cestui que Trust (3) That by a decree of your Honorable Court this Trustee Borrowed Fifteen Hundred Dollars on a Mortgage on the Trust property, and of which he has paid expenses of obtaining this as shown by the receipts. (4) That the said cestui que Trust is only entitled to the income for life and the property then goes to the children in fee. (5) That your trustee loaned the said Vernon W. Dorsey and his two sons who are of age the sum of five hundred dollars for which they gave him confessed judgment which is still due with interest and cost which is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 2. (6) Your Trustee believes the said Vernon W. Dorsey to be a dishonest man and is unwilling to pay any honest debt and seeks to have this trustee removed so as to cheat him out of the money he has advanced to the estate this trustee affirms that he only wants to be paid what has been advanced by him to said Estate and if necessary to hold said Trusteeship until the advances are repaid from income of the same or if the said advances are paid now by order of Court and this trustee paid the money advanced and the commissions due him from the estate then he is ready to resign as Trustee otherwise he claims the right to hold it until it is fully and fairly settled and satisfied affirming that has faithfully performed all the duties as trustee in the premises (7) This trustee says he received no money from the former Trustee whatsoever, and has received no money but what he has paid to the cestui que fund for expenses. (8) That is ready to execute any bond the Court may require at any time. (9) That he has not used the money borrowed on mortgage as alleged in improvements because he was notified by the parties in interested not to use the same in the said unimproved as they intended to sell the said farm under a decree of the Court.
