TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT.

The Petition of Vernon W. Dorsey, Regin W. Dorsey & Vernon W. Dorsey Jr, respectfully shows that upon the petition of your prtitioner filed in the above case on the 12th day of March A.D. 1887, your Honors passed an order requiring Joseph Wood Trustee in the above case to render an account to your Honorable Court of the execution of his trust by the time named in said order, wherein he was required to charge himself with all moneys by him received as such Trustee and furnish and furnish a detailed statement of his expenditures with vouchers thereof. (2) That on the 4th, day of April inst. said Joseph Wood procured an Auditors report to be filed in this case wherein he is charged with \$2359.70 as "Whole amount of receipts from the trust estate to April 1st, 1887" (3) That said Audit was made without any authority from your Honorable Court and without any legally sufficient data or evidence before the Auditor upon which to state said audit, and without said Joseph Wood Trustee, having filed a report to your Honorable Court as required by said order. (4) That said Joseph Wood has utterly failed to comply with the said order of your Honorable Court, although on the 5th, day of April inst, he did file a paper in this case which he demoniated an answer to said petition, wherein he has made certain scandalious and impertenant allegations, and which paper is in no sense a complaine with the said order of your Honorable Court. And your Petitioners pray. (1) That said Audit may be rejected and set aside at the personal cost of said Joseph Wood. (2) That said Joseph Wood Trustee, may be again required to render an account to your Honorable Court, under oath, of the execution of his said Trust. at an early date. (3) That your Petitioners may have all such other and further relief to which they may be entitled, and they will now prey &c.
