That all the settlements were thourgherly understood by said Vernon W. Dorsey and fortunally for your Trustee all the payments to said all the receipts given your Trustee by said Vernon W. Dorsey was drawn and given in the presents of good and respectable witnesses and included the expences, fertilizer and all expences as well as net income paid Dorsey your Trustee Reports that the Gross Receipts from said farm and trust Estate up to date from all and every source is Twenty three hundred and fifty nine dollars and seventy cents. Your trustee reports the gross payments including payments to Vernon W. Dorsey and advances to him and including Trustees commissions Twenty Nine Hundred and six dollars and eighty seven cents, being an overpayment by thid Trustee of Eight Hundred and five dollars and four cents. This report does not include the fifteen hundred dollars borrowed by your trustee on mortgage by order of this Court, nor does it include the judgment confessed to your trustee by said Vernon W. Dorsey and his two sons nor the costs and expences obtaining said decree. That these settlements were with said Dorsey at the time of the transaction when all the facts were fresh in mind, and fully known to said Vernon W. Dorsey, who while he himself would cheat once everybody, will allow no man to keep a cent of his Dorsey's money. These settlements were fully and fairly made and the final agreement and understanding witnessed by James McSherry then counsil for Dorsey who drew up the agreement and understanding in writing which will be produced at the proper time or when the Court may desire it. REPORT OF VERNON W. DORSEY AND COURTS ORDER

To yhe Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Ciurt for Frederick County sitting as a Court of Equity, The petition of Vernon W. Dorsey of Frederick County in the State of Maryland (1) respectfully shows, that heretofore on the twentyfifth day of January in the year A.D. 1881, Your Honors by an order then passed in No. 4535 Equity on the petition of Vernon W. Dorsey appointed Joseph Wood Trustee in the place and stead of H.W. Dorsey Waters and then said new Trustee entered upon the discharge of his duties an the discharge and gave bond in the penalty of Ten Thousand Dollars. (2) That by virtue of a decree passed by your Honorable Court on the 6th, day of July A.D. 1885 the said Joseph Wood trustee apointed was authorized and empowered to borrow the sum of fifteen hundred dollars upon a mortgage of said trust property said sum of fifteen hundred dollars to be appropriated to the present improvement of said property. (3) That pursuant to said decree the said Joseph Wood trustee borrowed the sum of fifteen hundred dollars upon a mortgage of said trust Estate from the Franklin Savings Bank of Frederick City. (4) That said Joseph Wood Trustee never appropriated said fifteen hundred dollars to the purposes intended by said decree (5) That said Mortgage is overdue and the interest thereon running unpaid (6) That your petitioner is interested in the said property and in the due administration of the said trust created by and under the conveyance heretofore mentioned and believes and charges that the said Joseph Wood trustee did not appropriate said fifteen hundred dollars to the purposes contemplated by said decree, and for the perpetution of said trust your petitioner thinks it necessary that said Joseph Wood trustee should report to your Honorable Court under oath the disposition made of the said fifteen hundred dollars hereinbefore mentioned. Wherefore your petitioner prays that your Honors may pass an order requiring the said Joseph Wood Trustee to State an account of said fund of fifteen hundred dollars under oath on or before a day to be therein named.
